

LICENSING INFORMATION

Under 18 Guidelines

- You are required by the State of Minnesota to take the MMSC Basic Rider Course.
- You must have a valid driver's license or valid instruction permit.
- At the completion of the course you will receive 2 cards for course enrollment and course completion.
- Take cards to the DVS to get Motorcycle Permit.
- Take skills test at DVS with your own motorcycle.
- Receive endorsement on driver's license.

Over 18 Guidelines

- You **must** have your motorcycle permit **before** taking the Basic Rider Course Skill Test. Permits can be obtained from a DVS exam station.
- You must have a valid driver's license and a stamped motorcycle permit to receive your motorcycle endorsement.



RANGE GEAR REQUIREMENTS

Basic Rider Course

- Motorcycle permit (if over 18)
- Driver's license or permit
- DOT-approved helmet
- Eye Protection – face shield, goggles, glasses or sunglasses
- Long sleeves
- Long pants
- Full-fingered gloves
- Over-the-ankle footwear

Intermediate Rider Course (Formerly BRC 2)

- Driver's license with either a motorcycle endorsement or a motorcycle permit
- DOT-approved helmet
- Eye Protection – face shield, goggles, glasses or sunglasses
- Long sleeves
- Long pants
- Full-fingered gloves
- Over-the-ankle footwear
- Your own street-legal motorcycle
- Proof of Insurance

Motorcycle Safety Training

Basic Rider Course (BRC) \$180

Learn how to ride, and earn your motorcycle license endorsement in this 14.5-hour course featuring 10 hours of on cycle training and 4.5 hours of classroom training. Supportive and friendly instructors will teach you how to operate a motorcycle and the basic skills you need to safely ride on the street. Training motorcycles are provided for riders of all sizes. If you're an automatic scooter rider you can bring your own scooter with proof of insurance if it's 500cc or less, 400 pounds or less, in good working order and registered as a motorcycle. Minnesota law requires motorcyclists under age 18 to pass an approved Rider Skills Training course. While no previous motorcycle riding experience is required, it can be beneficial. Students must be able to ride a bicycle and must possess a valid driver's license or motor vehicle instruction permit. Each student must furnish his or her own protective clothing and DOT-approved helmet. 100% attendance is mandatory.

If you are 18 years of age or older, you must obtain a motorcycle permit prior to taking the BRC. Upon a PASS status of the course, present your stamped permit at the DVS for full endorsement.

Intermediate Rider Course - \$55

If you are comfortable on your own motorcycle or scooter, the 5-hour Intermediate Rider Course will build upon your existing skills and knowledge. Newer motorcyclists, returning riders and experienced motorcyclists can all benefit from this course. The Intermediate Rider Course covers control, finesse, counter steering, cornering, swerving and braking. Make the Intermediate Rider Course an annual tune up for your riding skills. Groups or clubs may purchase an entire Intermediate Rider Course for only \$300. Passengers may participate for free. You must possess a valid driver's license with either a motorcycle endorsement or a motorcycle instruction permit. You must use your own street-legal motorcycle and show current proof of insurance during the first hour of the course. You must wear protective clothing and a DOT approved helmet.

Moped Course - \$35

This 4.5 hour course includes moped rules and regulations, defensive riding techniques, protective clothing, and alcohol information. Any 15-year-old who wants to ride a moped on the street must complete this course to obtain a moped instruction permit.
